#### Account allocations

You can reallocate your account during the 25-day reallocation period after each contract anniversary date.

## Partial surrenders<sup>5</sup>

Beginning in the first contract year, up to 10% of your contract value may be withdrawn each contract year without incurring charges.

## Market Value Adjustment (MVA)<sup>6</sup>

A positive or negative adjustment based on the current interest rate environment at the time of the surrender. The MVA does not apply to withdrawals after the surrender charge period, 10% annual free withdrawal, the death benefit or annuitized contracts.

# Nursing home and terminal illness benefits<sup>7</sup>

Allows access to contract value without surrender charge or MVA if certain conditions are met. Please see the Disclosure Statement for necessary criteria and conditions.

## Guaranteed Minimum Cash Surrender Value (GMCSV)

If you surrender your contract during the surrender charge period, you will never receive less than the GMCSV. The GMCSV is 87.5% of the total premium paid, less any surrenders and any taxes, accumulated at the GMCSV interest rate.

After the surrender charge period the cash surrender value is the greater of the GMCSV and the Guaranteed Minimum Nonsurrender Value (GMNSV).

The GMNSV is 100% of the premium paid, less any surrenders, surrender charges and taxes, accumulated at the GMNSV interest rate.

## Death benefit (prior to annuitization)

Upon the death of a contractowner or annuitant, beneficiaries may receive the greater of the contract value, GMCSV or GMNSV.

# Scheduled maturity date

The later of the 10th contract anniversary or the anniversary on or immediately following the annuitant's 95th birthday. Maturity date may be changed to any date after the second contract year.<sup>8</sup>

#### Choice of income options

You have the option, after the second contract year, to annuitize your full contract value without an MVA or surrender charge utilizing a number of income payment options, including an income that cannot be outlived. Rates and caps are declared by The Lincoln National Life Insurance Company at its discretion. Subsequent rates and caps may be higher or lower than the initial ones and may differ from those used for new contracts.
